TASK INFORMATION

Tasks start at 9.30am. Most end at about 4.30pm. Everyone is

welcome and your help will be valued for whatever time you can spare. However, if you are between 16 and 18 years old your parent or guardian must sign a consent form - please contact the HCV Secretary. Children under 16 must be accompanied by an adult who must be responsible for them at times. No previous experience is necessary. Instruction in techniques and safe working practice will be given.

WHAT TO BRING

You'll need a packed lunch and a mug, strong footwear (work boots, walking boots, or wellies for wet tasks), old warm clothes, and waterproofs. Sun protection is advisable (even in winter). We provide tools and protective gear, as well as tea and coffee.

HEALTH AND INSURANCE Insurance cover is arranged for the group on task. An upto-date anti-Tetanus injection is strongly advised for most outdoor activities. If you think you may not be covered on this or other health issues, you are advised to consult a health professional.

waders - be prepared to get wet!





Cutting of species rich hay meadow followed by apple scrumping to reward your hard work.






