You'll need a packed lunch and a mug, strong footwear (work boots, walking boots. or wellies for wet tasks), old clothes. warm waterproofs. Sun protection is advisable (even in winter). We provide tools protective gear, as well as tea and coffee.

HEALTH AND INSURANCE Insurance cover is arranged

for the group on task. An upto-date anti-Tetanus injection is strongly advised for most outdoor activities. If you think you may not be covered on this other or other health issues, you are advised to consult your doctor.

Chairman's Chat: Spring 2009

The last few months have been very busy for the group. Last November we were made aware of a new grant scheme for local community groups called Grassroots Grants, funded by the Cabinet Office of the Third Sector. We applied and were successful, receiving the maximum grant of £5,000 equipment, volunteer training, insurance, publicity for a conservation group." It has been a rush to spend the money by the end of March deadline. A bit over half the money has been spent on chainsaw equipment and training. Danny Kings has achieved his National Certificate of Competence, and this has already made a difference on tasks at Hawkenbury Meadow and Parndon Moat Marsh.

At Hawkenbury, in January we managed to coppice one large willow with just hand tools; on the most recent task there we did three, completing the coppice of the large willows in the middle of the meadow we have been working on slowly over the past few years. Other items of expenditure include a print run of the group's publicity leaflet with colour photos, some BTCV publications, waders and muck rake for pond work etc. We are also going for a long shaft hedge trimmer for use on the ground to cut reeds on the marshes.

Are we right to use noisy petrol power tools? Cont...

The intention is these power tools should assist with particularly heavy jobs, not take the place of our skilled volunteers. The chainsaw should be used only to fell the largest trees we tackle that might take the whole day with a bow saw, to cut large trunks to manageable size, and trim off stumps. There will still be plenty of opportunity to volunteers to fell the smaller trees by hand in peace and quiet, aside from the odd puff or groan of effort.

What about the use of petrol fuelled equipment it is not exactly zero-carbon. In trying to save the planet are we perhaps helping to kill it? Maybe in future such power tools will run on bio-ethanol, electric powered from a hydrogen fuel cell produced by wind energy, or from a steam engine-powered generator running on the wood we cut down. Perhaps at some stage our carbon rations will get so tight we'll go back to a world of woodsmen felling trees with huge old-fashioned 2-man crosscut saws, but then we wouldn't need nature reserves anyway. Right now I think we should be doing what we can in the most effective way to conserve the habitats to ensure the survival of the greatest biodiversity; and tools available at the moment run on fossil fuel. The world may eventually with the right technology tackle or even reverse climate change, but if in the meantime species are lost through habitat deterioration, there is no chance of getting them back. Well that's my view - what do you think?

Netteswell Plantation Footbridge

Having been squeezed into third place in last year's Harlow Hotspots competition some funds have been found for the materials for this project. As I write it is touch and go whether the materials can be sourced by the inevitable 31st March funding deadline. But if it does go ahead with the tasks as planned in the programme, it will be a really good task to work on. It should also act as a catalyst for bringing the site which is one of the town's county wildlife sites into "positive conservation management".

Greenteam Volunteers

At the HCV AGM back in October I mooted the idea that there was scope for tasks midweek over and above the long established Tuesday Wildspace group at Parndon Wood. There are many people free during the week who would prefer to come out then rather than at the weekend. Darren Fazackerley was thinking along the same lines, and he has been able to push this idea along much faster than we could have on a purely voluntary basis. The result is the GreenTeam Volunteers programme of tasks currently once a month on Wednesdays mainly on the county wildlife sites. The programme is more or less firmed up till the end of the year we've agreed to publish an outline of the programme in the HCV newsletter.



Sunday 19th April Installation of Bearers



Come along to the annual Wildlife Fayre to help HCV provide demonstrations and education on the tasks we carry out and skills we learn.


